Understanding This User Manual

The sections of this manual generally follow the features of your device. A robust index for features begins on page 147.

Also included is important safety information, beginning on page 122, that you should know before using your device.

This manual gives navigation instructions according to the default display settings. If you select other settings, navigation steps may be different.

Unless otherwise specified, all instructions in this manual assume that you are starting from a Home screen. To get to a Home screen, you may need to unlock the device. For more information, refer to *"Securing Your Device"* on page 8.

Note: Instructions in this manual are based on default settings and may vary from your device depending on the software version on your device and any changes to the device's settings.

Unless stated otherwise, instructions in this user manual start with the device unlocked, at the Home screen.

All screen images in this manual are simulated. Actual displays may vary depending on the software version of your device and any changes to the device's settings.

Special Text

In this manual, some text is set apart from the rest. This special text is intended to point out important information, share quick methods for activating features, define terms, and more. The definitions for these methods are as follows:

- Notes: Presents alternative options for the current feature, menu, or sub-menu.
- Tips: Provides quick or innovative methods or useful shortcuts.
- Important: Points out important information about the current feature that could affect performance.
- Warning: Brings important information to your attention that can help to prevent loss of data or functionality or damage to your device.

Text Conventions

This manual provides condensed information about how to use your device. To make this possible, the following text conventions are used to represent often-used steps:

→ Arrows are used to represent the sequence of selecting successive options in longer, or repetitive, procedures. For example:

From a Home screen, touch the Menu Key $\blacksquare \Rightarrow$ Settings \Rightarrow Wireless and network \Rightarrow Wi-Fi settings.

Battery

Your device is powered by a rechargeable, standard Li-Ion battery.

Note: The battery comes partially charged. You must fully charge the battery before using your device for the first time.

After the first charge, you can use the device while charging.

Warning!: Use only approved charging devices. Approved accessories are designed to maximize battery life. Using other accessories may invalidate your warranty and may cause damage.

Battery Indicator

The Battery icon in the Status Bar shows the battery power level. When battery power is 15% or less, your device prompts you to charge the battery. If you continue to operate the device without charging, the device powers off.

Charging the Battery

Use a Samsung-approved Travel Charger to charge your device from any standard AC power outlet.

 Locate the Charger/Accessory Port on the bottom of the device.



Charger/Accessory Port

 Plug the flat end of the Travel Charger into the Charger/ Accessory Interface connector on the device (1) and the other end into a standard AC wall outlet.

Warning!: While the device is charging, if the touch screen does not function due to an unstable power supply, unplug the USB power adapter from the power outlet or unplug the USB cable from the device.

 When charging is finished, remove the flat end from the Charger/Accessory Interface connector on the device.

Turning Your Device On and Off

Turning Your Device On

Press and hold the Power/Lock Key _____.



Note: Your device's internal antenna is located along the top back of the device. Do not block the antenna; doing so may affect signal quality and may cause the device to operate at a higher power level than is necessary.

Turning Your Device Off

- 1. Press and hold the Power/Lock Key ____.
- 2. At the prompt, touch Power off.

Your Google Account

Your new device uses your Google account to fully utilize its Android features, including Gmail, Maps, Navigation, Google Talk and the Android Market. When you turn on your device for the first time, set up a connection with your existing Google account or create a new Google account.

To create a Google account or set up your Google account on your device use **Accounts and sync** settings. For more information, refer to "Accounts and Sync" on page 114.

Using Google Maps

In order to use some applications related to Google Maps, you must first connect Wi-Fi. For more information, refer to "Wi-Fi Settings" on page 103.

You must also enable location services to use Google Maps. Some features require Standalone or Google location services. For more information, refer to *"Location and Security"* on page 110.

Task Manager

Your device can run applications simultaneously and some applications run in the background.

Use Task Manager to see which applications are running on your device and to end running applications to extend battery life. You can also uninstall applications from your device and see how much memory is used by applications.

Task Manager provides information about applications, including Active applications, Downloaded, RAM, Storage, and Help.

To access the Task Manager:

- Touch the Active applications tab to view applications running on your device. Touch Exit to end an application or Exit all to stop all running applications.
- Touch the Downloaded tab to view applications installed from Android Market. Touch Uninstall to remove an application from your device.
- Touch the RAM tab to display the amount of Random Access Memory (RAM) currently in use. Touch Clear memory to clear inactive and background processes.

- Touch the Storage tab to view internal and external storage memory statistics.
- 6. Touch the **Help** tab to view useful tips for extending battery life.
- Tip: To launch Task Manager from any screen, touch and hold the Home Key 🔄 , then touch Task manager.

You can also access Task Manager from the **Program Monitor** widget. For more information, refer to *"Widgets"* on page 20.

Memory Card

Your device supports removable microSDTM or microSDHCTM memory cards, for storage of music, photos, videos, and other files.

Note: You can only store music files that you own (from a CD or purchased with the device) on a memory card.

Installing a Memory Card

- 1. Open the Memory Card Slot cover and turn to expose the slot.
- With the gold contacts facing down, carefully slide the memory card into the slot, pushing gently until it clicks into place.

3. Replace the Memory Card Slot cover.



Removing a Memory Card

Important!: To prevent damage to information stored on the memory card, unmount the card before removing it from the device.

- From a Home screen, touch the Menu Key → Settings
 → SD card and device storage → Unmount SD card.
- 2. Open the Memory Card Slot cover and turn to expose the slot.

- 3. Gently press down on the memory card, so that it pops out from the slot, and carefully pull the card out.
- 4. Replace the Memory Slot cover.

Galaxy Player 5.0 Accessories

The items supplied with your device may vary depending on the software and accessories available in your region.

- You can obtain additional accessories from your local Samsung dealer.
- The supplied accessories perform best for your device.
- Accessories other than the supplied ones may not be compatible with your device.

Securing Your Device

By default, the device locks automatically when the screen times out or you can lock it manually. You can unlock the device using one of the default Unlock screens or, for increased security, use a personal screen unlock pattern.

Locking the device manually

▶ Press the **Power/Lock Key** ____.

Unlocking the device

1. Press the Power/Lock

Key 💿.

The locked screen displays Sweep glass to unlock. The day, date, and time also display.

 Touch and sweep across the screen, either to the left or right, as indicated on the screen.

Note: You can choose the type of Screen Unlock you want to use, either Pattern or Password. For more information, refer to "Location and Security" on page 110.



Troubleshooting

If your device has fatal errors, hangs up, or freezes, you may need to close all programs or reset the device to regain functionality.

- If your device is still responsive, but a program is frozen, close the program using the Task Manager. For more information, refer to "Task Manager" on page 7.
- If your device is frozen and unresponsive, press and hold the **Power/Lock Key** of r 8 to 10 seconds.

Android System Recovery

Android System Recovery is used for Google updates. The average user should never need to perform a system recovery.

Note: If you entered this menu by mistake, use the Volume Up/Down key to select reboot system now, then touch the Home Key . Your device then continues to boot up.

To enter the Android System Recovery mode, follow these steps:

- 1. Turn the device off.
- Press the Volume Up Key
 and then press the Power/Lock Key
 at the same time until the device switches on.

Tip: Volume Up is the end closest to the top of the device.

- Once the SAMSUNG logo appears, release the Power/Lock key while continuing to press the Volume Up key.
- Continue to press the Volume Up key until the Android System Recovery screen displays.

5. Release the Volume Up key.

The following options are available:

- reboot system now: Turns on your device.
- apply update from sdcard: Used to apply an update file from your microSD card.
- wipe data/factory reset: Deletes all data from the device except captured pictures and videos. For more information, refer to "Factory Data Reset" on page 116.
- wipe cache partition: Deletes all cache data, such as log files.
- Press the Volume Up/down key to scroll up or down, then touch the Home Key
 to make a selection.

Front and Top Views

The following items can be found on the front and top of your device as illustrated.

- 1. Strap Hole: Allows you to attach an optional strap.
- 2. External Speaker: Used for music or video playback, notification tones, and for other sounds.
- 3. Memory Card Slot: Open Memory Card Slot cover and turn to expose the slot to install a memory card for storage of files. For more information, refer to *"Installing a Memory Card"* on page 7.
- 4. Front-facing Camera Lens: Used when taking photos.
- 5. Menu Key: Touch to display options for the current screen.
- Home Key: Touch to display the Home screen. Touch and hold to display recent applications or to launch Task Manager. Touch to wake the screen for unlocking.
- 7. Back Key: Touch to return to the previous screen or option.



Side View

The following items can be found on the side of your device.

- Power/Lock Key: Press and hold to turn the device on or off. Press to lock the device or to wake the screen for unlocking.
- Volume Key: From a Home screen, press to adjust Master Volume.
 During music playback, press to adjust volume.

Back and Bottom Views

The following items can be found on the back and bottom of your device.

 External Speakers: Used for music or video playback, notification tones, and for other sounds.



- Camera Lens: Used to take photos or record videos.
- 3. Camera Flash: Used when taking photos.
- 3.5mm Headset Jack: Plug in for headphones, which also serve as an antenna. For more information, refer to "FM Radio" on page 68.
- 5. Microphone: Used for voice recording or video chat.
- 6. Charger/Accessory Port: Allows you to connect a Travel Charger or other



optional accessories such as a USB/data cable to sync music and files.

Home Screen

The Home screen is the starting point for using your device.

Note: Unless stated otherwise, instructions in this User Manual start with the device unlocked, at the Home screen.

- Status Bar: Presents icons to show notifications, battery power, and connection details. For a list of icons, see "Status Bar" on page 18.
- Widgets: Applications that run on the Home screen. These widgets are found on the Home screen by default. For more information, refer to "Widgets" on page 20.
- Shortcuts: Shortcuts to common applications. These shortcuts are found on the Home screen by default. For more information, refer to "Shortcuts" on page 21.
- Home screen: The starting point for using your device. Place shortcuts, widgets, and other items to customize your device to your needs.
- Primary Shortcuts: Shortcuts to common features. For more information, refer to "Primary Shortcuts" on page 20.



Extended Home Screen

The Home screen consists of the Home panel, plus six panels that extend beyond the display width to provide more space for adding shortcuts, widgets, and folders.

Slide your finger horizontally across the screen to scroll to the left or right side panels. As you scroll, the indicator at the top of the display shows your current position.

Customizing the Home Screen

To customize the Home screen to suit your preferences just navigate to the desired Home screen, then touch and hold on the screen to display the **Add to Home screen** menu. Then touch one of the options:

Adding and Removing Home Screen Panels

Your device comes with seven Home screen panels. You can customize the Home screen by removing or adding panels.

Note: The panel in the first position displays when you touch the Home Key \frown .

- 1. From a Home screen, touch the Menu Key $\blacksquare \rightarrow$ Edit.
- 2. Use these controls to configure panels:

Remove: Touch and drag a panel to the Trash Can to remove the panel from the Home screen.

- Add: Touch to add a new panel, up to a total of seven. This option is available when less than seven panels have been added.
- **3.** To rearrange the order of panels, touch and drag a panel to a new location.

Tip: You can also display Edit options by pinching the Home screen.

Navigating Your Device

Use command keys and the touch screen to navigate.

Command Keys

Menu Key

Touch the **Menu Key** to display options for the current screen or feature.

Home Key

Touch the **Home Key** to display the first Home screen.

Touch and hold the **Home Key** to launch a menu of recent applications or to launch Task Manager.



Back Key

Touch the **Back Key** to return to the previous screen, option, or step.

Google Search

Touch the **Google Search** widget to search the web and your device. The Google Search widget is found on the Home panel by default. For more information, refer to *"Google Search"* on page 63.

Context-Sensitive Menus

Context-sensitive menus offer options for features or screens. To access context-sensitive menus:

- Touch the Menu Key 🔲 .
- · Touch and hold on an item.

Finger Gestures

Touch

Touch items to select or launch them. For example:

- Touch the on-screen keyboard to enter characters or text.
- · Touch a menu item to select it.
- Touch an application's icon to launch the application.

Touch and Hold

Activate on-screen items. For example:

- Touch and hold a widget on the home screen to move it.
- Touch and hold on a field to display a pop-up menu of options.

Swipe, Flick, or Slide

Swipe, flick, or slide your finger vertically or horizontally across the screen. For example:

- · Unlocking the screen
- · Scrolling the Home screens or a menu.

Pinch

Use two fingers, such as your index finger and thumb, to make an inward pinch motion on the screen, as if you are picking something up, or an outward motion by sweeping your fingers out. For example:



- · Pinch the Home screen to show customization options.
- Pinch a photo in Gallery to zoom in.

Notification Panel

The Notification Panel shows information about connections, messages, and other items.

To display the Notification Panel:

Sweep your finger downward from the top of the screen.

From the Notification Panel, the following options are available:

- 1. Touch an icon to activate the feature.
- 2. Touch to clear all notifications.
- 3. Touch a notification to open the application.
- Touch and hold, then slide your finger up to close the Notification Panel or touch the Back Key .



Icons

Icons at the top of the Notification Panel show status for:

- Wi-Fi: Touch to enable or disable Wi-Fi. For more information, refer to "Wi-Fi" on page 79.
- Bluetooth: Touch to enable or disable Bluetooth. For more information, refer to "Bluetooth" on page 80.
- GPS: Touch to enable Standalone GPS services. For more information, refer to "Use GPS Satellites" on page 110.
- Sound / Vibration: Touch to toggle between sound and vibration.

 Auto rotation: Touch to enable or disable auto rotation. When enabled, the screen orientation changes when you rotate the device. When disabled, the screen locks in the current orientation (horizontal or vertical) and the orientation does not change when you rotate the device.

Clearing Notifications

- Sweep your finger downward from the top of the screen to display the Notifications Panel.
- 2. Touch a notification to clear it.

– or –

Touch Clear to clear all notifications.

Status Bar

The Status Bar displays icons to show connection status, battery power, and other details.



System Alert: Check Notifications Panel for alerts.



Battery Full: Battery is fully charged. Disconnect device from power source.



Battery Level: Shown partially charged.



Device Power Critical: Battery has only three percent power remaining. Charge immediately.



Charging Indicator: Battery is charging. Displays when connected to a standard AC wall outlet or to a computer by way of a USB cable.



USB Connected: Device is connected to a computer using a USB cable.



Updates Available: Updates to the applications you have downloaded are available.



Download in Progress: An application is being downloaded to the device.

Download Successful: A recent software download was successfully downloaded.



Flight Mode: Indicates that the Flight Mode is active, which allows you to use many of your device's features, but it cannot access online information or applications.



New Email Message: You have new email.



New Gmail Message: You have new Gmail.



Google Talk Invitation: Someone has invited you to chat using Google Talk.



Refresh: An account is being refreshed.



Alarm Set: An alarm is active. For more information, refer to *"Clock"* on page 88.



Silent Mode: All sounds except media and alarms are silenced, and Vibrate mode is not active. See "Silent Mode" on page 107.



Vibrate Mode: All sounds are silenced, and Vibrate is set to Always or Only in Silent mode. For more information, refer to "Vibrate" on page 107.



Media Scanner: The media scanner is active.



Preparing SD Card: A memory card has been mounted and is being prepared for use. For more information, refer to "SD Card and Device Storage" on page 116.



Bluetooth Active: Bluetooth is turned on.



Music Player: A song is playing. Touch the Music icon or display the Notification Panel to see the song title and music player controls. For more information, refer to "Music Player" on page 66.



Wi-Fi Active: Wi-Fi is connected, active, and communicating with a Wireless Access Point (WAP).



Wi-Fi Action Needed: Action needed to connect to Wireless Access Point (WAP).



GPS Active: Displays when GPS is active.



Navigation Active: The Navigation app is active. For more information, refer to "Navigation" on page 62.

Primary Shortcuts

Primary Shortcuts appear at the bottom of the display.



Music: Play music stored on an optional installed memory card. For more information, refer to *"Music Player"* on page 66.



Videos: Play and manage videos stored on an installed memory card. For more information, refer to "Videos" on page 74.



Internet: Access the Internet. Appears on the Home screen by default. For more information, refer to *"Internet"* on page 54.

Widgets

Widgets are self-contained applications that you can place on the Home screen to access your favorite features.

Adding Widgets to the Home screen

- 1. Navigate to the desired Home screen.
- 2. To display the Add to Home screen menu:
 - Touch and hold on the screen.
 - or –
 - Touch the Menu Key $\blacksquare \rightarrow$ Add.
- Touch Widgets, then touch a widget to add it to the Home screen.

Removing Widgets

Touch and hold the Widget until Remove appears at the bottom of the screen, then drag the Widget to the Remove icon to remove it.

New folder: Create a new empty folder.



All contacts: Create a folder containing all contacts.

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Contacts with phone numbers: Create a folder containing contacts with stored phone numbers.

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Received list from Bluetooth: Create a folder containing a list of items received from Bluetooth.

Removing Folders

Touch and hold the Folder until Remove appears, then drag the Folder to the Remove icon.

Wallpapers

You can choose a picture to display in the background of the Home screen. Choose from preloaded wallpaper images or select a photo you have downloaded or taken with the Camera.

 From a Home screen, touch and hold on the screen to display the Add to Home screen menu, then touch Wallpapers.

– or –

From a Home screen, touch the Menu Key

→ Wallpaper.

- 2. Choose a source for images:
 - Gallery: Access the Gallery to choose a picture from an installed memory card. Touch a picture to select it, then use the crop tool to resize the picture, if desired. Touch Save to save the picture as wallpaper.
 - Live wallpapers: Choose from pre-loaded interactive animated wallpapers. Touch a wallpaper to see an example. Touch Set wallpaper to save your choice.
 - Wallpaper gallery: Choose from pre-loaded wallpaper images. Touch a wallpaper, then touch Set wallpaper.

Applications

The Applications screen holds all applications on your wireless device. Applications that you download and install from the Android Market or from the web are also added to the Applications screen.

You can place shortcuts to applications on the Home screen for quick access to the application. For more information, refer to *"Adding Shortcuts from Applications"* on page 22.


Linked Contacts

Your device can synchronize with multiple accounts, including Google, Corporate Exchange, and other email providers, plus social networking sites like Facebook, Twitter, and MySpace. Linking, or joining, imported contact records allows you to see all the contact's numbers and addresses together in one Contact entry. Virtual QWERTY Keyboard

Your device uses a virtual QWERTY keyboard for text entry. Use the keyboard to enter letters, punctuation, numbers, and other characters into text entry fields or applications. Access the keyboard by touching any text entry field.

The virtual QWERTY keyboard displays at the bottom of the screen. By default, when you rotate the device, the screen orientation updates to display the keyboard at the bottom of the screen.



Swype Keyboard

Text Input Methods

Your device offers several text input methods. This section explains two of them.

- Swype: Swype™ is a new text input method that allows you to enter words by gliding your finger over the virtual QWERTY keyboard, lifting your finger between words. You can also enable Word prediction, which matches your key touches to common words.
- Samsung Keypad: The Samsung Keyboard is a virtual QWERTY keyboard that allows you to enter text by touching keys on the screen. The Samsung Keypad includes predictive text, which matches your key touches to common words so that you can select the word to enter it into your text.



Entering Text Using Swype

SwypeTM is a new way to enter text on touch screens. Instead of touching each key, use your finger to trace over each letter of a word. For each word, place your finger on the first letter and glide to the subsequent letters, lifting on the last letter.



The following example shows how to enter the word "this". Put your finger down on the "t" and, without lifting, glide it to the "h", then to the "i", then over to the "s".



Here are a few tips to get you started:

- Auto-spacing: When you finish a word, just lift your finger and start the next word.
- Double letters: Just "scribble" on the key.
- Auto-capitalization: Swype recognizes and capitalizes the first word of sentences. If you want to capitalize a word that is not at the beginning of a sentence, just glide above the keyboard before gliding over the next letter.
- Contractions: Swype recognizes most words that include an apostrophe, just swype the letters of the word, including the apostrophe.
- Punctuation: Touch and hold a key to view a punctuation menu and make a selection.

- Accented characters: Just glide through the letters of the word. Swype usually recognizes the word and correctly accents the letters.
- Error correction: If you make a mistake, double-tap on the word you want to change.

- Touch and hold SVM or ABC to display the numeric keyboard and quickly enter numbers and mathematical operators.
- Touch ABC to display the alphabetic keyboard.

Using Swype Speech Recognition

Enter text by speaking. Swype recognizes your speech and enters text for you.

Entering Text Using the Samsung Keypad

The Samsung Keypad is a custom virtual QWERTY keyboard, featuring predictive text. Input characters by touching the on-screen keys with your finger or use speech recognition.

As you enter characters, predictive text matches your key touches to common words and displays them. Select a word from the display to insert it into your text.



Configuring the Keypad

To configure the Samsung Keypad to your preferences:

Entering Upper and Lower Case Letters

The default case is lower case (abc). Enter upper and lower case alphabet letters by touching the Shift key to toggle the case, before touching the letter key(s).

Entering Symbols and Numbers

To enter a number, touch **2123** , then touch the corresponding key.

To enter common symbols, touch **2123** to switch to Symbols mode, then touch the corresponding key.

There are three pages of symbols. Touch **1**/3 to switch to the next page.

Touch and hold a vowel key (A, E, I, O, U, or Y) or the C, N, or S key to open a small window where you can touch an accented vowel or other alternate letter.

Touch and hold the Period key (.) to open a small window with a set of common symbols and Emoticons.

Using XT9 Predictive Text

XT9 is a predictive text system that has next-letter prediction and regional error correction, which compensates for users touching the wrong keys on QWERTY keyboards.

1. Touch **Settings** at the bottom of the keypad.

- 2. Touch the XT9 field so a green check mark appears next to the field.

Editing Text

You can edit the text you enter in text fields by cutting, copying, or pasting text. These operations can be performed within and across apps. However, some apps do not support editing some or all of the text displayed while others may offer their own way to select text.

Editing Existing Text

To edit text that you have entered:

- Touch and drag the Cursor to a better position, if necessary.
- 3. Enter additional text or delete text by repeatedly touching the **Delete** key.

Copying, Deleting, or Replacing Text

To select and copy, delete, or replace text:

- Touch and hold the text or word you want to select. The Edit text pop-up displays.
- Touch Select word or Select all. The selected text is highlighted with a tab at each end of the selection.
- Drag a selection tab to expand or reduce the range of selected text.

4. On the pop-up, touch **Copy** to copy the selected text, **Cut** to copy and remove the selected text, or **Paste** to replace the selected text with text previously saved to the clipboard. - or -

Enter text by typing or speaking to replace the selection with what you type.

Touch the **Delete** key to delete the selected text.

Tip: Touch on another area of the screen to unselect the text.

Pasting Text

To paste previously copied text:

Touch the text at the point you want to paste the copied 1. text.

The Cursor displays at the point you touched.

Closing the Keyboard

Using the Handwriting Feature

You can enter text simply by using your finger to handwrite letters on your screen.



- Working... is displayed while the software is converting 3. your voice to text.

The text is displayed in the message.

4. Touch Speech Recognition again to speak and add more test.

Note: The feature works best when you break your message down into smaller segments.

Section 5: Messaging

This section describes how to send and receive messages and other features associated with messaging.

Types of Messages

Your device supports these types of messages:

- · Gmail: Send and receive Gmail from your Google account.
- Email: Send and receive email from your email accounts, including Corporate Exchange mail.
- Google Talk: Chat with other Google Talk users.

Note: Your Wi-Fi-only device does NOT support voice calling and messaging services. Please disregard any "dial" and "message" related menus because some Gmail options are identically set in all Android devices.

Gmail

Send and receive email with Gmail, Google's web-based email.

Tip: To set up your Google account on your device, use Accounts and sync settings. For more information, refer to "Accounts and Sync" on page 114. ▶ From the Home screen, touch **Gmail** .

– or –

From a Home screen, touch Applications

→ Gmail 🖄.

Setting Up Your Gmail Account

The first time you launch Gmail, your device prompts you to set up your Google account.

- - 1. From the Home screen, touch **Gmail** M.
 - 2. At the Add a Google Account screen, touch Next to begin, then touch an option:
 - Create: Follow the prompts to create a new account.
 - Sign in: Enter your Google Username and Password, then touch Sign In.
 - The device communicates with the Google server to set up your account and synchronize your email. When complete, your Gmail appears in the Inbox.

Refreshing Your Gmail Account

Refresh your account to update your device from the Gmail servers.

- 1. From the Home screen, touch **Gmail** M.
- 2. Touch the Menu Key $\blacksquare \rightarrow$ Refresh.

Managing Your Gmail Account

Use menu options to manage your Gmail.

- 1. From the Home screen, touch **Gmail** 🖄.
- 2. Touch the Menu Key 🔲 for these options:
 - Refresh: Update your device from the Gmail servers.
 - Compose: Create and send new Gmail.
 - Accounts: Choose a Gmail account or add a Google account.
 - Go to labels: View Gmail by label.
 - Search: Enter keywords to search mail.
 - More:
 - Settings: Configure settings. For more information, refer to "Gmail account settings" on page 48.
 - Help: Learn about using Gmail.
 - About: View information about Gmail.

Composing and Sending Gmail

- 1. From the Home screen, touch Gmail 🖄
- 2. Touch the Menu Key $\blacksquare \rightarrow$ Compose.
- Touch the To field to enter recipients. As you enter names or email addresses, matching contacts display. Touch a contact to add it to the field.
- 4. Touch the Subject field to enter a subject.
- 5. Touch Compose Mail to enter the text of your email.
- 6. While composing a message, touch the Menu Key 📄 for these options:
 - Send: Send the message.
 - Save draft: Save the message as a draft for sending later.
 - Add Cc/Bcc: Create Cc (copy) and Bcc (blind copy) fields in the message. After creating the fields, touch to enter recipients.
 - Attach: Launch Gallery to select a photo to add to the message.
 - **Discard**: Close the message without saving.
 - Help: Learn about using Gmail.
- Touch to send the message or to save the message as a draft.

Gmail account settings

- From the Home screen, touch Gmail 1.
- 2. Touch the Menu Key $\blacksquare \rightarrow$ More \rightarrow Settings for settings:

General preferences

- Message Actions: Set how you want message actions to show at the top of the screen. Options are: Always show, Only show in portrait, and Don't show.
- Clear search history: Remove previous searches you performed.
- Clear "Show pictures": Restores the default setting (do not show pictures automatically) for all the people who send you email, including those whose Show pictures setting you may have changed when reading messages from them.

Account settings

- General settings
 - Priority Inbox: This setting is only available if you have configured Gmail on the web to show Priority Inbox. If available, you can set Priority Inbox as the conversation list to open when you have new mail, rather than Inbox.
 - Signature: Create a text signature to add to outgoing messages.

- **Confirm actions**: Have your device prompt you to confirm Archive, Delete, and Send actions.
- Reply all: Enable or disable Reply All as the default action when responding to messages.
- Auto-advance: Choose a screen to show after you delete or archive a conversation.
- Message text size: Set the size of text in message displays.
- Batch operations: Allow changes to labels on more than one conversation.
- Sync inboxes and labels: Choose which labels are synchronized.
- Notification settings:
 - Email notifications: When enabled, notifications for new email appear in the Status Bar.
 - Labels to notify: Set notification preferences for synced labels. Touch Inbox or Priority Inbox to set your preferences.

Add account

- Touch Google or Samsung account to add a new account.

Email

Use Email to view and manage all your email accounts in one application.

Setting Up Email Accounts

- From a Home screen, touch Applications → Email
 → Email
- At the Set up email account screen, enter an Email address and Password and touch Next.
- Enter an account name for the email account just added, which is displayed on the inbox for the email account.
- Enter your name, which is displayed on outgoing messages.
- 5. Touch Done.

The device communicates with the appropriate server to set up your account and synchronize your email. When complete, your email appears in the Inbox for the account. Enter account credentials, then complete set-up by following the prompts to configure account options. Available options vary, depending on the provider.

If the account includes synchronization of contacts and calendars, you can choose whether to synchronize these features with your device.

Adding Additional Email Accounts

To add additional email accounts:

 From a Home screen, touch Applications → Email
 → Email
 .

The list of email accounts displays.

Note: If you only have one email account set up, touch Menu Key → Add account to display the list of email accounts.

Managing Emails

 - Text size: Choose the text size for email in this account. Options are: Small, Medium, and Large.
- View mode: Set the view mode to Standard view or Conversation view.

- 8. Touch Attach to add an attachment. Choices are:
 - File: Select a file from My files.
 - Pictures: Select a picture from Gallery.
 - Videos: Select a video from Gallery.
 - Audio: Select an audio file from My files.
 - Take picture: Open the camera and take a picture.
 - Capture video: Open the video recorder and shoot a video.
 - Record audio: Open the voice recorder and make a recording.
 - **Contacts**: Open your contact list so contacts can be selected to attach a contact namecard file.
 - **Calendar**: Open your calendar so calendar events, like birthdays and anniversaries, can be selected to attach an invite file.
 - Memo: Open the Memo app and attach a memo.

The selected or created file is attached. Touch \bigcirc to remove the attachment.

- 9. While composing a message, touch the Menu Key is for these options:
 - Save as draft: Save the message in Drafts.

- Add text: Lets you add text to your email from:
 - Contacts: Touch contact information to select it, then touch Submit.
 - Calendar: Touch one or more calendar events, then touch Add.
 - Memo: Touch one or more memos, then touch Attach.
- Touch Send to send the message or Discard to cancel the email.

Configuring Email Account Settings

Account Settings lets you use settings to configure handling of email on your device.

Note: Available settings may depend on the email account and include setting how much email to synchronize, creating signatures for emails you send, and other handling options.

To configure email account settings at any time:

- From a Home screen, touch Applications → Email → Email
- 2. Touch an account, if you have set up more than one account.

3. Touch the Menu Key $\blacksquare \rightarrow$ More \rightarrow Account settings.

The following options display depending on the type of account:

General settings

- Account name: Enter a name to identify this account.
- Your name: Enter your name, to appear on emails from this account.
- Email check frequency: Lets you configure how often the device queries the remote server for new email changes. Options are: Never, Every 5 minutes, Every 10 minutes, Every 15 minutes, Every 30 minutes, or Every hour.
- **Default account:** When enabled, email from your device is automatically sent from this account.

Notification settings

- Email notifications: When enabled, the New Email icon appears in the Status Bar when a new email arrives.
- **Select ringtone**: Choose a ringtone for email notifications for this account.
- Vibrate: When enabled, email notifications for this accounts are accompanied by vibration.

Server settings

• Incoming settings: Configure server settings.

- Outgoing settings: Configure outgoing settings. Common Settings
- Recent messages: Set the number of recent messages. Options are: 25, 50, 75, 100, 200, or Total.
- Forward with files: Enable or disable forwarding of file attachments.
- Add signature: Enable or disable adding a signature.
- Signature: Enter a signature to add to emails from this account.

Google Talk

Google Talk is a free Windows and web-based application for instant messaging offered by Google. Conversation logs are automatically saved to a Chats area in your Gmail account. This allows you to search a chat log and store them in your Gmail accounts.

Tip: Talk requires that you have a Google account. To set up your Google account on your device use **Accounts and sync** settings. For more information, refer to "Accounts and Sync" on page 114. 1. From the Home screen, touch Talk (talk).

– or –

From a Home screen, touch Applications $\blacksquare \rightarrow$ Talk (^{talk}).

- 2. Touch Next to set up a Google account or to Sign in.
- Touch Create to create a new Google account.
 or –

Touch Sign in, if you have an existing Google account.

Note: If you have already set up your Google account, you are automatically logged in.

- 4. After entering your user name and password, touch Done.
- 5. Touch Sign in.

Once sign in is complete, the Talk screen displays.

- 6. Touch the Menu Key 🔲 to display the following options:
 - All friends / Most popular: List all friends or the most popular friends.
 - Add friend: Use the keypad to enter an invitation to a friend, then touch Send invitation.
 - Search: Enter a search term and search Google Talk.
 - Sign out: Close Google Talk and display the Home screen.

- Settings: Offers various settings for Google talk.
- More: Displays the following options:
 - Close all chats: Terminates any chats that you have open.
 - Invites: Lists any pending invitations that you have sent.
 - Blocked: Lists any friends that you have blocked.
- Touch and hold a Friend entry to display the following options: Start chat, Friend info, Block friend, Remove friend, View contact, Auto show friend / Always show friend, and Hide friend.

Note: If you touch the Hide friend option, touch Menu Key $\blacksquare \rightarrow$ Add friend \rightarrow Send invitation to make the Friend visible again.

 Touch a Friend's entry to display the Chat entries for that Friend.

Internet

Your device is equipped with a full HTML Browser that allows you to access the internet.

From a Home screen, touch Internet

Tip: Internet appears by default as a Primary shortcut on the Home screen.

Navigating the Web

Command Keys

- Touch the **Back Key** to return to the previous page.
- Touch to display Bookmarks, Most visited, and History.
- Touch the Menu Key → Forward to go forward to a recent page.

Touching and dragging

 Touch and drag your finger on the screen to navigate pages and to reposition pages within the screen.



Entering text in a field

 While browsing, touch a text field to display the virtual QWERTY keyboard to enter text.

Zoom

- Tap the screen twice to zoom in or out.
- Use two fingers, such as your index finger and thumb, to zoom out by making an inward pinch motion on the screen. To zoom in, make an outward motion by sweeping your fingers out.



Tip: For convenient browsing, you can rotate the device to landscape mode.

- Open in background: When enabled, new windows open behind the current window.
- Set home page: View and set the default first page that displays when you launch the Browser.
- Default storage: The default location for downloads.

Privacy settings

- Clear cache: Delete content and databases stored on the device.
- Clear history: Delete the list of previously-visited pages.
- Accept cookies: When enabled, allows Browser to save and read cookie information used by web pages.

- Clear all cookie data: Delete cookie information saved to the device.
- Remember form data: When enabled, stores information you enter into forms to make future forms easier.
- Clear form data: Deletes saved form information.
- Enable location: When enabled, sites you visit can request access to your location.
- Clear location access: Clear location access for all web sites.

Security settings

- Remember passwords: When enabled, saves usernames and passwords for sites you visit, to make future visits easier.
- Clear passwords: Clear all saved usernames and passwords.
- Show security warnings: When enabled, the Browser warns you if there is a problem with a site's security.

Advanced settings

- Select search engine: Select the search engine you want to use. Choices are: Google, Yahoo!, and Bing.
- Website settings: View and manage settings for individual web sites.
- Reset to default: Clear all browser data and reset all settings to the factory defaults.

Maps

Use Google Maps to find your current location, get directions, and other location-based information.

- Tip: The Google Maps shortcut appears on the main Home screen by default. For information about adding shortcuts to a Home screen, see "Adding Shortcuts from a Home Screen" on page 21.
- Note: You must enable location services to use Maps. Some features require Standalone or Google location services. For more information, refer to "Location and Security" on page 110.

 - Sign In: Enter your Google Username and Password, then touch Sign In.
 - Cache Settings: Set your Prefetch on mobile preference and Clear map tile cache, if necessary.
 - Help: Learn about Google maps.
 - Terms, Privacy & Notices: View information about Google Maps, including the Terms and Conditions, Privacy Policy, Legal Notices, and Web History.
 - About: View information about Maps.

Other Map Options

Touch the indicated icon to use these additional Map options:



Search Maps: Use the keypad to enter your request to Search the map for a city, location, and so on. Suggestions are displayed as you type. Touch speak a city, location, and so on, to display.



Places: Launch the Places app. For more information, refer to *"Places"* on page 63.



Layers: Enable or disable a map layer to display. Choose from Traffic, Satellite, Terrain, Transit Lines, Latitude, My Maps, Bicycling, or Wikipedia. Touch Clear Map to remove previous layers.



Compass: Set the map to always display north at the top of the screen or to automatically rotate like a compass, keeping north on the map facing north, and so on. Your device may have to be calibrated the first time you use this feature. Follow the on-screen instructions.

Latitude

With Google Latitude, you can see the location of all of your friends on a map or on a list. You can also share or hide your location.

You must first set up your tablet to use wireless networks to help pinpoint your location. Also, Latitude works best when Wi-Fi is enabled.

To enable Wi-Fi:

- 2. Touch Location and security → Use wireless networks.

A green check mark 🗹 indicates the feature is enabled.



- Macro: Set Macro mode to take close-up pictures. Face detection causes the camera to automatically recognize if there is a face in the shot. It then optimizes the focus and exposure the face.
- Scene mode: Choose an automatic scene mode from None, Portrait, Landscape, Night, Sports, Party/ Indoor, Beach/Snow, Sunset, Dawn, Fall colour, Firework, Text, Candlelight, or Backlight.
- Timer: Set a 2, 5, or 10 second timer.
- Resolution: Set a size for the image. Options are: 3.2M (2048x1536), 2.4M (2048x1232), 2M (1600x1200), 1.5M (1600x960), 0.3M (640x480), or 0.4M (800x480).
- White balance: Set the light source. Options are: Auto, Daylight, Cloudy, Incandescent, or Fluorescent.

- Effects: Apply an effect to photos. Options are: Normal, Negative, Black and white, or Sepia.
- Metering: Set how the camera measures or meters the light source: Centre-weighted, Spot, or Matrix.
- Image quality: Choose a quality setting for photos. Options are: Superfine, Fine, or Normal.
- Adjust: Used to adjust Contrast, Saturation, and Sharpness.



Settings: Touch for the following options:

- Guidelines: Used to enable or disable the guidelines.
- Review: Activate the instant review feature, which displays images immediately after capture. A check mark displayed next to the feature indicates Review is enabled.
- GPS: Enable or disable tagging of photos with your GPS location. A displays on the screen when this option is active.

• **Shutter sound**: Enable or disable one of the camera's three shutter sounds.

Your device includes features to connect to the internet and to other devices by using Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, or a USB cable. Your device also supports removable microSD[™] or microSDHC[™] memory cards for storing music, photos, videos, and files.

Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi is a wireless networking technology that provides access to local area networks. Use your device's Wi-Fi feature to:

- · Access the internet for browsing or to send and receive email.
- Access your corporate network.
- Use hotspots provided by hotels or airports while traveling.

Wi-Fi communication requires access to an existing Wireless Access Point (WAP). WAPs can be Open (unsecured, as with most hotspots) or Secured (requiring you to provide login credentials). Your device supports the 802.11 b/g/n/a Wi-Fi protocol.

Configuring Wi-Fi Settings

Finding Wi-Fi Networks

You can have your device automatically notify you of available networks. For more information, refer to *"Network Notification"* on page 104.

Turning Wi-Fi On or Off

Adding a Wi-Fi Network Manually

 → Wireless and network → Wi-Fi settings.
- 2. Touch Wi-Fi to turn Wi-Fi On.
- Touch Add Wi-Fi network, then enter information about the network:
 - Network SSID: Enter the name of the Wi-Fi Wireless Access Point.

Note: Depending on the Security protocol used by the WAP, additional network information may be required.

Bluetooth

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communications technology for exchanging information over a distance of about 30 feet.

You do not need to line up the devices to send information with Bluetooth. If the devices are in range, you can exchange information between them, even if they are in different rooms.

Pairing with a Bluetooth Device

Search for a Bluetooth device and pair with it, to exchange information between your device and the target device.

Tip: After pairing, your device and the target device recognize each other and exchange information without having to enter a passcode or PIN.

- From a Home screen, touch the Menu Key → Settings
 → Wireless and network → Bluetooth settings.
- 2. Touch Bluetooth to turn on Bluetooth.
- 3. Enable the target device's discoverable or visible mode.
- 4. Touch Scan devices.
- From the list of scanned devices, touch the target device, then follow the prompts to complete the pairing:
 - If the target device requires a PIN, enter a PIN for the target device and touch OK. When prompted, enter the PIN on the target device.

 If the device allows automatic or smart pairing, your device attempts to pair with the device automatically. Follow the prompts on your device and the target device to complete the pairing.

Samsung Kies

Samsung Kies is a software that enables you to update your device firmware by connecting to the PC.

Memory Card

Formatting a Memory Card

Formatting erases all content from the memory card and prepares it for use with your device.

 When finished, exit Windows Media Player and disconnect the USB cable.

Connecting as a Mass Storage Device

You can connect your device to a PC as a removable disk and access the file directory. If you insert a memory card in the device, you can also access the files directory from the memory card by using the device as a memory card reader.

- Note: The file directory of the memory card displays as folder external_sd, separate from the internal memory.
 - Insert a memory card into the device to transfer files from or to the memory card.
 - From a Home screen, touch the Menu Key → Settings
 → Wireless and network → USB settings, then touch Mass storage.

- Attach your device to the computer with the USB cable. Your device recognizes the connection and displays the USB mass storage screen.
- 4. Touch Connect storage to PC.

A pop-up window displays on the PC when connected.

- 6. Copy files from the PC to the memory card.
- When finished, close the PC folder and disconnect the USB cable.

This section contains a description of each application that is available in the Applications Menu, its function, and how to navigate through that particular application. If the application is already described in another section of this user manual, then a cross reference to that particular section is provided. Various widgets are also described.

Tip: To open applications quickly, add the icons of frequently-used applications to one of the Home screens. For details, see "Adding Shortcuts from Applications" on page 22.

GPS Applications

GPS applications allow you to achieve real-time, GPS-enabled, turn-by-turn navigation and to access local searches based on a variety of category parameters.

To receive better GPS signals, avoid using your device in the following conditions:

- · inside a building or between buildings
- · in a tunnel or underground passage
- · in poor weather
- · around high-voltage or electromagnetic fields
- in a vehicle with tinted windows

Global GPS turn-by-turn navigation, mapping, and Point of Interest content is available for three continents, including North America (U.S., Canada, and Mexico), Western Europe, and China, where wireless coverage is available.

Important!: If you touch or cover the internal GPS antenna while using GPS services, it may impede the GPS signal resulting in the GPS services not working in an optimal manner. Refer to the following diagram to locate the approximate location of the internal GPS antenna.



AllShare

Use AllShare to share multimedia content from your device through Wi-Fi with DLNA (Digital Living Network Alliance) certified devices. With AllShare, you can:

- Play multimedia content from your device on another player, such as a Wi-Fi-capable TV or other playback device.
- Play multimedia content from another source, such as a wireless media server, on your device.
- Play multimedia content from another source, such as a wireless media server, on another device. Your device retrieves content from the source and uses Wi-Fi to deliver it to another device and acts as a remote to control playback.

Note: AllShare uses your device's Wi-Fi services. For more information about Wi-Fi, see "Wi-Fi" on page 79.

Configuring AllShare

Configure AllShare settings to identify your device as a server, connect to Wi-Fi, and set treatment of copied files.

- 1. From a Home screen, touch Applications
 - → AllShare

- 2. Touch Settings to configure these settings:
- Note: In the following settings, references to *phone* are actually references to your *Player*.
 - Media server name: Use the keypad to enter a new media server name, if desired (the default is your device's default name), then touch Save.
 - Share media: Allows you to restrict what is shared from your device. Touch the items you want to share and touch OK.
 - Access point network: Turn on your Wi-Fi service and connect to an available Wi-Fi Access Point.

 - Default memory: Choose the default location for saving downloaded files, from Phone or Memory card.
 - 3. Touch one of the following options:
 - Play file from my phone on other player: You can enjoy multimedia content saved on your device on your TV or Hi-Fi. You can then use your device like a remote control.
 - Play file from server on my phone: You can enjoy multimedia content saved on other devices, such as your PC or laptop, on your device.

- Play file from server on other player via my phone: You can enjoy multimedia content saved on your PC or laptop using other devices like your TV or Hi-Fi. You can then use your device like a remote control.
- 4. Follow the on-screen instructions.

Calculator

The calculator provides the basic arithmetic functions: addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. You can also use this as a scientific calculator.

- From a Home screen, touch Applications → Calculator ×÷.
- 2. Enter the first number using the numeric keys.
- 3. Enter the operation for your calculation by touching the
 - + (add), (subtract), × (multiply), or \div (divide) key.
- 4. Enter the next number.
- 5. To view the result, touch the = (equals) key.
- 6. Repeat steps 3 through 5 as many times as required.

Rotate your device to display the scientific calculator in landscape mode.

Calendar

Record events and appointments to manage your schedule.

- 1. From a Home screen, touch Applications
 - → Calendar ^m.
- 2. Touch a tab to choose a calendar view:
 - Month: Display the current month and scroll to other months.
 - Week: Display the current week and scroll to other weeks.
 - Day: Display today's schedule and scroll to other days.
 - List: Display events in a chronological list.
- 3. Touch the Menu Key 🔲 for these options:
 - Search: Search the calendar for a particular word or words.
 - Create: Create a new event for any day or time period.
 - Go to: Display a specific date.
 - Today: Displays today's date, if it is not already being displayed.
 - Delete: Delete an event.
 - Settings: Customize the calendar. For more information, refer to "Customizing the Calendar" on page 87.



Power Control

Active applications, Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, GPS, Synchronization, or the LCD Brightness functionality all act to drain your battery.

The Power Control widget is designed to quickly activate (turn on) or deactivate (turn off) those functions or applications that use the most battery power.

The following is a list of helpful tips that can help conserve your battery power:

- Reduce your backlight time.
- Turn off Bluetooth, Wi-Fi, and Synchronization when not in use.
- Deactivate the GPS when it is not needed. Most applications that use this function periodically query the GPS satellites for the current location. Each query drains your battery.
- Turn off Automatic application synchronization.
- Close any applications that may be running in the background (such as Music Player).

To use the Power Control shortcut bar:

- From the Home screen, touch and hold an empty area until the Add to Home screen menu displays.
- 2. Touch Widgets → Power control.

The Power Control shortcut is added to the Home screen.

 Touch one of the icons on the Power Control widget to activate the application (Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, GPS, Synchronization, or LCD Brightness).



A green bar displayed beneath the icon means the application is activated (turned on).

 Touch one of the icons a second time to deactivate the application.

The green bar is removed from beneath the icon, which means the application is deactivated (turned off).

- 3. Touch Activate now and then touch Close to activate ThinkFree Office on your device.

Four tabs display:

- Home: Displays the introduction to ThinkFree Office and lists a short description of each of the tabs and what type of information they provide.

This section explains Settings for customizing your device.

Accessing Settings

There are two ways to access your device settings:

From a Home screen, touch the Menu Key → Settings. - or -

From a Home screen, touch Applications

→ Settings

The first method is used in this section.

Wireless and Network

Control your device's wireless connections.

Flight Mode

Flight mode allows you to use many of your devices's features, such as Camera, Games, and more, when you are in an airplane or in any other area where accessing data is prohibited.

Important!: When your device is in Flight Mode, it cannot access online information or applications.

- From a Home screen, touch the Menu Key → Settings
 → Wireless and network.
- Touch the Flight mode check box to enable Flight mode. A check mark displayed next to the feature indicates Flight mode is active.

Wi-Fi Settings

Your device supports Wi-Fi b/g/n/a. Use Wi-Fi settings to manage your device's Wi-Fi connections.

For more information about using your device's Wi-Fi features, see "*Wi-Fi*" on page 79.

Turning Wi-Fi On or Off

Turn your device's Wi-Fi service on or off. When you turn Wi-Fi service on, your device automatically searches for available, in-range Wireless Access Points (WAPs).

- From a Home screen, touch the Menu Key → Settings
 → Wireless and network.
- Touch Wi-Fi settings, then touch Wi-Fi to turn Wi-Fi On or Off. When on, a check mark appears in the check box.

Network Notification

Have your device alert you to new Wireless Access Points (WAPs).

- From a Home screen, touch the Menu Key → Settings
 → Wireless and network.
- Touch Wi-Fi settings, then touch Network notification to turn notifications On or Off. When on, a check mark appears in the check box.

WPS Button Connection

The WPS (Wi-Fi Protected Setup) button is a standard for easy and secure wireless network set up and connections. To use WPS, the connecting device must support WPS and be compatible with Wi-Fi Protected Access (WPA) security. WPS can automatically set up a random network name and WPA wireless security for wireless Wi-Fi phones, routers, access points, computers, adapters, and other electronic devices.

WPS allows you to push buttons instead of entering a network name and wireless security PIN.

- 1. From a Home screen, touch the Menu Key $\blacksquare \rightarrow$ Settings
 - \rightarrow Wireless and network \rightarrow Wi-Fi settings.
- 2. Touch WPS button connection.

 Press the WPS button on your Wi-Fi access point within 2 minutes.

Advanced Settings

Set up and manage wireless access points.

- From a Home screen, touch the Menu Key → Settings
 → Wireless and network → Wi-Fi settings.
- 2. Touch the Menu Key $\blacksquare \rightarrow$ Advanced for these settings:
 - Advanced:
 - Wi-Fi sleep policy: By default, Wi-Fi turns off when the screen times out and data connections switch to mobile data. Use Wi-Fi sleep policy settings to specify when to switch from Wi-Fi to mobile data for data communications. Touch to choose from When screen turns off, Never when plugged in, or Never.
 - MAC address: View your device's MAC address, required when connecting to some secured networks (not configurable).
 - Proxy: Touch to enter a proxy number.
 - Port: Touch to enter a port number.
 - IP Settings: Enter IP settings for configuring a connection to a network using a static IP, including:
 - Use static IP: Touch to turn static IP On or Off.
 - IP address: Enter the IP address.
 - Gateway: Enter the gateway.
 - Netmask: Enter the netmask.

- DNS 1: Enter the DNS1.
- DNS 2: Enter the DNS2.

Bluetooth Settings

Use Bluetooth settings to manage Bluetooth connections, set your device's name, and control your device's visibility.

Turning Bluetooth On or Off

To turn your device's Bluetooth service On or Off:

- 1. From a Home screen, touch the Menu Key $\blacksquare \rightarrow$ Settings
 - \rightarrow Wireless and network \rightarrow Bluetooth settings.
- Touch Bluetooth to turn Bluetooth On or Off. When On, a check mark appears in the check box.

For more information about using Bluetooth to exchange information with other Bluetooth devices, see "*Bluetooth*" on page 80.

Additional Bluetooth Settings

When Bluetooth is on, additional settings are available.

 - \rightarrow Wireless and network \rightarrow Bluetooth settings.

- 2. Touch a setting to configure Bluetooth:
 - Device Name: Your device's default name appears on screen. Touch to change the device name. Available when Bluetooth is turned On.
 - Discoverable: Control your device's visibility to other devices' Bluetooth searches. Touch to turn On or Off. Available when Bluetooth is turned On.
 - Scan devices: Touch to scan for nearby discoverable devices. After searching, touch a device to pair with it. For more information, refer to "Pairing with a Bluetooth Device" on page 81.

USB Settings

Configure how your device is identified when you attach it to a computer with a USB cable.

- From a Home screen, touch the Menu Key → Settings
 → Wireless and network.
- 2. Touch USB settings to choose a setting:
 - Samsung Kies: Samsung Kies is a software suite that allows you to search and download applications directly from a PC. The applications are then installed onto a mobile device when synced with a PC, providing instant back up and peace of mind for application downloads. - $\bullet\,$ Touch Set VPN server, add a name using the keypad, then touch $\ensuremath{\textit{OK}}.$
- Touch Enable Encryption to make a check mark 🗹 , if desired.
- Touch **DNS search domains**, add a name for DNS search using the keypad, then touch **OK**.
- 4. To establish a L2TP (Layer 2 Tunneling Protocol):
 - Touch Add L2TP VPN.
 - Touch VPN name, add a name for this connection using the keypad, then touch OK.
 - $\bullet\,$ Touch Set VPN server, add a name using the keypad, then touch OK.
 - Touch Enable L2TP secret to make a check mark , if desired.
 - Touch Set L2TP secret and enter a password, if desired, then touch OK.
 - Touch **DNS search domains**, add a name for DNS search using the keypad, then touch **OK**.
- To establish a L2TP/IPSec PSK (Pre-shared key based L2TP/IPSec):
 - Touch Add L2TP/IPSec PSK VPN.
 - Touch **VPN name**, add a name for this connection using the keypad, then touch **OK**.
 - \bullet Touch Set VPN server, add a name using the keypad, then touch $\mathbf{OK}.$

- Touch Set IPsec pre-shared key, enter a key and touch OK.
- Touch Enable L2TP secret to make a check mark , if desired.
- Touch Set L2TP secret and enter a password, if desired, then touch OK.
- Touch DNS search domains, add a name for DNS search using the keypad, then touch OK.
- To establish a L2TP/IPSec CRT (Certificate based L2TP/ IPSec):
 - Touch Add L2TP/IPSec CRT VPN.
 - Touch VPN name, add a name for this connection using the keypad, then touch OK.
 - $\bullet\,$ Touch Set VPN server, add a name using the keypad, then touch 0K.
 - Touch Enable L2TP secret to make a check mark V, if desired.
 - Touch Set L2TP secret and enter a password, if desired, then touch OK.
 - Touch Set user certificate, then touch OK.
 - Touch Set CA certificate, then touch OK.
 - Touch DNS search domains, add a name for DNS search using the keypad, then touch OK.

Sound

General

Silent Mode

Temporarily silence all the sounds your device makes except for media playback and alarms.

- From a Home screen, touch the Menu Key → Settings → Sound.
- Touch Silent mode to enable or disable silent mode. When enabled, a check mark appears in the check box.

Vibrate

Vibrate mode allows your device to vibrate instead of a tone.

- From the Home screen, touch the Menu Key → Settings → Sound → Vibrate.
- Touch Always, Never, Only in Silent mode, or Only when not in Silent mode.

Volume

Set the volume level for all types of sounds.

Note: You can only set volume when Silent Mode is disabled.

Note: The Notification volume option does not appear if Use Incoming call volume for notifications is checked.

3. Touch OK to save your setting.

Tip: You can also set Media volume from the Home screen by pressing the Volume Key.

Notifications

Notification Ringtone

Select a default ringtone for message, alarm, and other notifications.

Audible Selection

Display

Font Style

Set the font for screen displays.

- From a Home screen, touch the Menu Key → Settings → Display.
- Touch Font style to choose a font style or touch Get fonts online to browse and download a new font.

Brightness

Set the default screen brightness.

- From a Home screen, touch the Menu Key → Settings → Display → Brightness.
- 2. Touch and drag the slider to set the brightness.
- 3. Touch OK to save the setting.

Auto-Rotate Screen

Switch orientation automatically when rotating your device.

- From a Home screen, touch the Menu Key → Settings
 → Display.
- Touch Auto-rotate screen to enable or disable the mode. When enabled, a check mark appears in the check box.

Animation

Set the level of animations for transitions between screens.

- From a Home screen, touch the Menu Key → Settings
 → Display → Animation.
- 2. Touch No animation, Some animations, or All animations.

Screen Time-out

Set the length of delay between the last key press or screen touch and the automatic screen time-out (dim and lock).

- From a Home screen, touch the Menu Key → Settings
 → Display → Screen time-out.
- 2. Touch a setting to select it.

Power Saving Mode

When enabled, your device automatically analyzes the screen and adjusts the brightness to conserve battery power.

- From a Home screen, touch the Menu Key → Settings → Display.
- Touch Power saving mode to enable or disable the mode. When enabled, a check mark appears in the check box.

Horizontal Calibration

Horizontal calibration allows you to horizontally calibrate your display using the accelerometer.

- From a Home screen, touch the Menu Key → Settings
 → Display → Horizontal calibration.
- 2. Place your device on a level surface and touch Calibrate.

Location and Security

You value your privacy. So, by default, your device only acquires your location when you dial 911. To use Location-Based Services, you must first enable location services on your device.

My Location

Use Wireless Networks

Before you use applications such as Google Maps and find your location or search for places of interest, you must enable the Use wireless networks option or enable the GPS satellites.

- From a Home screen, touch the Menu Key → Settings → Location and security.
- Touch Use wireless networks to enable location information using the wireless network.

Use GPS Satellites

- From a Home screen, touch the Menu Key → Settings → Location and security.

Set Screen Lock

Choose settings for unlocking your screen. For more information about using the lock and unlock features, see *"Securing Your Device"* on page 8.

 Location and security.
- Touch Set screen lock/Change screen lock for these settings:
 - None: Touch to disable all screen lock settings.
 - Pattern: A screen unlock pattern is a touch gesture you create and use to unlock your device. Follow the prompts to create or change your screen unlock pattern.
 - **PIN**: Touch to create a Personal Identification Number (PIN) for unlocking the screen.
 - Password: Touch to create a password for unlocking the screen.

Passwords

Visible Passwords

When enabled, password characters display briefly as you touch them while entering passwords.

 From a Home screen, touch the Menu Key → Settings → Location and security. Touch Visible passwords to enable or disable brief displays of password characters. When enabled, a check mark appears in the check box.

Device Administration

Add or remove device administrators.

Use Secure Credentials

You can install credentials from an installed memory card and use Credential storage settings to allow applications to access the secure certificates and other credentials.

- Touch Use secure credentials to enable or disable. When enabled, a check mark appears in the check box.

Note: You must have installed encrypted certificates from a memory card to use this feature.

Install Encrypted Certificates

Install encrypted certificates from an installed memory card.

Note: You must have installed a memory card containing encrypted certificates to use this feature.

- From a Home screen, touch the Menu Key → Settings
 → Location and security.
- 2. Touch Install encrypted certificates from SD card, then choose a certificate and follow the prompts to install.

Set Password

Set or change a password to protect credentials.

Clear stored credentials and reset the password.

Samsung Apps

Using the Samsung Apps option, the device notifies you when there are new applications in Samsung Apps.

- 3. Under USB storage:
 - Total memory and Available memory display usage of the internal device memory.
 - Touch Format USB storage to format (erase) all data in internal memory. Read the warning and then touch Format USB storage.
- 4. Under System storage:
 - Available memory displays usage for your device's 2GB internal memory.

Language and Keyboard

Select Locale

Set the language used by your device.

- From a Home screen, touch the Menu Key → Settings
 → Language and keyboard → Select locale.

Exposure to Radio Frequency (RF) Signals

Although GALAXY is not a cell phone, it can operate on the same network as cell phones and can use the same Radio Frequency (RF) signals to communicate with the network as a cell phone. Therefore, although the following information refers specifically to RF exposure from wireless phones, it may apply similarly to GALAXY when it is being used on a cell phone network.

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has published information for consumers relating to Radio Frequency (RF) exposure from wireless phones. The FDA publication includes the following information:

Do cell phones pose a health hazard?

Many people are concerned that cell phone radiation will cause cancer or other serious health hazards. The weight of scientific evidence has not linked cell phones with any health problems.

Cell phones emit low levels of Radio Frequency (RF) energy. Over the past 15 years, scientists have conducted hundreds of studies looking at the biological effects of the radio frequency energy emitted by cell phones. While some researchers have reported biological changes associated with RF energy, these studies have failed to be replicated. The majority of studies published have failed to show an association between exposure to radio frequency from a cell phone and health problems.

The low levels of RF cell phones emit while in use are in the microwave frequency range. They also emit RF at substantially reduced time intervals when in the stand-by mode. Whereas high levels of RF can produce health effects (by heating tissue), exposure to low level RF that does not produce heating effects causes no known adverse health effects.

The biological effects of radio frequency energy should not be confused with the effects from other types of electromagnetic energy.

Very high levels of electromagnetic energy, such as is found in X-rays and gamma rays, can ionize biological tissues. Ionization is a process where electrons are stripped away from their normal locations in atoms and molecules. It can permanently damage biological tissues including DNA, the genetic material.

The energy levels associated with radio frequency energy, including both radio waves and microwaves, are not great

enough to cause ionization of atoms and molecules. Therefore, RF energy is a type of non-ionizing radiation. Other types of nonionizing radiation include visible light, infrared radiation (heat), and other forms of electromagnetic radiation with relatively low frequencies.

While RF energy does not ionize particles, large amounts can increase body temperatures and cause tissue damage. Two areas of the body, the eyes and the testes, are particularly vulnerable to RF heating because there is relatively little blood flow in them to carry away excess heat.

Research Results to Date: Is there a connection between RF and certain health problems?

The results of most studies conducted to date say no. In addition, attempts to replicate and confirm the few studies that have shown a connection have failed.

The scientific community at large therefore believes that the weight of scientific evidence does not show an association between exposure to Radio Frequency (RF) from cell phones and adverse health outcomes. Still the scientific community has supported additional research to address gaps in knowledge. Some of these studies are described below.

Interphone Study

Interphone is a large international study designed to determine whether cell phones increase the risk of head and neck cancer. A report published in the International Journal of Epidemiology (June, 2010) compared cell phone usage for more than 5,000 people with brain tumors (glioma and meningioma) and a similar number of healthy controls.

Results of this study did NOT show that cell phones caused brain cancer. In this study, most people had no increased risk of brain cancer from using cell phones. For people with the heaviest use of cell phones (an average of more than ½ hour per day, every day, for over 10 years) the study suggested a slight increase in brain cancer. However, the authors determined that biases and errors prevented any conclusions being drawn from this data. Interphone is the largest cell phone study to date, but it did not answer all questions about cell phone safety. Additional research is being conducted around the world, and the FDA continues to monitor developments in this field.

International Cohort Study on Mobile Phone Users (COSMOS)

The COSMOS study aims to conduct long-term health monitoring of a large group of people to determine if there are any health issues linked to long-term exposure to radio frequency energy from cell phone use. The COSMOS study will follow approximately 300,000 adult cell phone users in Europe for 20 to 30 years. Risk of Brain Cancer from Exposure to Radio Frequency Fields in Childhood and Adolescence (MOBI-KIDS)

MOBI-KIDS is an international study investigating the relationship between exposure to radio frequency energy from communication technologies including cell phones and brain cancer in young people. This is an international multi-center study involving 14 European and non-European countries. Surveillance, Epidemiology, and End Results (SEER) Program of the National Cancer Institute

The National Cancer Institute (NCI) actively follows cancer statistics in the United States to detect any change in rates of new cases for brain cancer. If cell phones play a role in risk for brain cancer, rates should go up, because heavy cell phone use has been common for quite some time in the U.S. Between 1987 and 2005, the overall age-adjusted incidence of brain cancer did not increase. Cell Phone Industry Actions

Although the existing scientific data do not justify FDA regulatory actions, the FDA has urged the cell phone industry to take a number of steps, including the following:

- Support-needed research on possible biological effects of RF for the type of signal emitted by cell phones;
- Design cell phones in a way that minimizes any RF exposure to the user; and
- Cooperate in providing users of cell phones with the current information on cell phone use and human health concerns.

Reducing Exposure: Hands-Free Kits and Other Accessories

Steps to Reduce Exposure to Radio Frequency Energy

If there is a risk from being exposed to Radio Frequency (RF) energy from cell phones — and at this point we do not know that there is — it is probably very small. But, if you are concerned about avoiding even potential risks, you can take a few simple steps to minimize your RF exposure.

• Reduce the amount of time spent using your cell phone;

• Use speaker mode or a headset to place more distance between your head and the cell phone.

Hands-Free Kits

Hands-free kits may include audio or Bluetooth® headsets and various types of body-worn accessories such as belt-clips and holsters. Combinations of these can be used to reduce RF energy absorption from cell phones.

Headsets can substantially reduce exposure because the phone is held away from the head in the user's hand or in approved body-worn accessories. Cell phones marketed in the U.S. are required to meet RF exposure compliance requirements when used against the head and against the body.

Because there are no known risks from exposure to RF emissions from cell phones, there is no reason to believe that hands-free kits reduce risks. Hands-free kits can be used for convenience and comfort. They are also required by law in many states if you want to use your phone while driving.

Cell Phone Accessories that Claim to Shield the Head from RF Radiation

Because there are no known risks from exposure to RF emissions from cell phones, there is no reason to believe that accessories which claim to shield the head from those emissions reduce risks. Some products that claim to shield the user from RF absorption use special phone cases, while others involve nothing more than a metallic accessory attached to the phone. Studies have shown that these products generally do not work as advertised. Unlike "hands-free" kits, these so-called "shields" may interfere with proper operation of the phone. The phone may be forced to boost its power to compensate, leading to an increase in RF absorption.

Children and Cell Phones

The scientific evidence does not show a danger to any users of cell phones from RF exposure, including children and teenagers. The steps adults can take to reduce RF exposure apply to children and teenagers as well.

- · Reduce the amount of time spent on the cell phone;
- Use speaker mode or a headset to place more distance between the head and the cell phone.

Some groups sponsored by other national governments have advised that children be discouraged from using cell phones at all. For example, The Stewart Report from the United Kingdom made such a recommendation in December 2000. In this report, a group of independent experts noted that no evidence exists that using a cell phone causes brain tumors or other ill effects. Their recommendation to limit cell phone use by children was strictly precautionary; it was not based on scientific evidence that any health hazard exists.

Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) Certification Information

Your mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the exposure limits for Radio Frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government.

These FCC exposure limits are derived from the recommendations of two expert organizations: the National Council on Radiation Protection and Measurement (NCRP) and the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE).

In both cases, the recommendations were developed by scientific and engineering experts drawn from industry, government, and academia after extensive reviews of the scientific literature related to the biological effects of RF energy.

The exposure limit set by the FCC for wireless mobile devices employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate (SAR). The SAR is a measure of the rate of absorption of RF energy by the human body expressed in units of watts per kilogram (W/kg). The FCC requires wireless devices to comply with a safety limit of 1.6 watts per kilogram (1.6 W/kg). The FCC exposure limit incorporates a substantial margin of safety to give additional protection to the public and to account for any variations in measurements.

SAR tests are conducted using standard operating positions accepted by the FCC with the mobile device transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the mobile device while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the mobile device is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output.

Before a new model mobile device is available for sale to the public, it must be tested and certified to the FCC that it does not exceed the exposure limit established by the FCC. Tests for each model of a device are performed in positions and locations (e.g. near the body) as required by the FCC.

For typical operations, this mobile device has been tested and meets FCC RF exposure guidelines.

Use of other accessories may not ensure compliance with FCC RF exposure guidelines.

The FCC has granted an Equipment Authorization for this mobile device with all reported SAR levels evaluated as in compliance with the FCC RF exposure guidelines. The maximum SAR values for this model device as reported in the FCC equipment authorization grant are:

- Head: 0.057 W/kg.
- Body-worn: 0.07 W/kg.

GALAXY should not be relied upon for essential communications (medical emergencies, calls to 911, or communications to emergency services). Care and Maintenance

Your mobile device is a product of superior design and craftsmanship and should be treated with care. The suggestions below will help you fulfill any warranty obligations and allow you to enjoy this product for many years:

Keep your Samsung Mobile Device away from:

Liquids of any kind

Keep the mobile device dry. Precipitation, humidity, and liquids contain minerals that will corrode electronic circuits. If the mobile device does get wet, do not accelerate drying with the use of an oven, microwave, or dryer, because this may damage the mobile device and could cause a fire or explosion. Do not use the mobile device with a wet hand. Doing so may cause an electric shock to you or damage to the mobile device.

Extreme heat or cold

Avoid temperatures below 0°C / 32°F or above 45°C / 113°F.

Microwaves

Do not try to dry your mobile device in a microwave oven. Doing so may cause a fire or explosion.

Dust and dirt

Do not expose your mobile device to dust, dirt, or sand.

Cleaning solutions

Do not use harsh chemicals, cleaning solvents, or strong detergents to clean the mobile device. Wipe it with a soft cloth slightly dampened in a mild soap-and-water solution.

Shock or vibration

Do not drop, knock, or shake the mobile device. Rough handling can break internal circuit boards.

Paint

Do not paint the mobile device. Paint can clog the device's moving parts or ventilation openings and prevent proper operation.

Responsible Listening

Caution !: Avoid potential hearing loss.

Damage to hearing occurs when a person is exposed to loud sounds over time. The risk of hearing loss increases as sound is played louder and for longer durations. Prolonged exposure to loud sounds (including music) is the most common cause of preventable hearing loss. Some scientific research suggests that using portable audio devices, such as portable music players and cell phones, at high volume settings for long durations may lead to permanent noise-induced hearing loss. This includes the use of headphones (including headsets, earbuds, and Bluetooth® or other wireless devices). Exposure to very loud sound has also been associated in some studies with tinnitus (a ringing in the ear), hypersensitivity to sound, and distorted hearing. Individual susceptibility to noise-induced hearing loss and potential hearing problem varies. Additionally, the amount of sound produced by a portable audio device varies depending on the nature of the sound, the device settings, and the headphones that are used. As a result, there is no single volume setting that is appropriate for everyone or for every combination of sound, settings, and equipment.

You should follow some common sense recommendations when using any portable audio device:

- Always turn the volume down before plugging the earphones into an audio source.
- Set the volume in a quiet environment and select the lowest volume at which you can hear adequately.
- Be aware that you can adapt to higher volume settings over time, not realizing that the higher volume may be harmful to your hearing.
- When using headphones, turn the volume down if you cannot hear the people speaking near you or if the person sitting next to you can hear what you are listening to.
- Do not turn the volume up to block out noisy surroundings. If you choose to listen to your portable device in a noisy environment, use noise-cancelling headphones to block out background environmental noise. By blocking background environment noise, noise cancelling

headphones should allow you to hear the music at lower volumes than when using earbuds.

- Limit the amount of time you listen. As the volume increases, less time is required before you hearing could be affected.
- Avoid using headphones after exposure to extremely loud noises, such as rock concerts, that might cause temporary hearing loss. Temporary hearing loss might cause unsafe volumes to sound normal.
- Do not listen at any volume that causes you discomfort. If you experience ringing in your ears, hear muffled speech, or experience any temporary hearing difficulty after listening to your portable audio device, discontinue use and consult your doctor.

Operating Environment

Remember to follow any special regulations in force in any area, and always switch your mobile device off whenever it is forbidden to use it, or when it may cause interference or danger. When connecting the mobile device or any accessory to another device, read its user's guide for detailed safety instructions. Do not connect incompatible products.

Using Your Mobile Device Near Other Electronic Devices

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from Radio Frequency (RF) signals. However, certain electronic equipment may not be shielded against the RF signals from your wireless mobile device. Consult the manufacturer to discuss alternatives.

Implantable Medical Devices

A minimum separation of six (6) inches should be maintained between a handheld wireless mobile device and an implantable medical device, such as a pacemaker or implantable cardioverter defibrillator, to avoid potential interference with the device.

Persons who have such devices:

- Should ALWAYS keep the mobile device more than six (6) inches from their implantable medical device when the mobile device is turned ON;

Other Medical Devices

Opting out of this dispute resolution procedure will not affect the coverage of the Limited Warranty in any way, and you will continue to enjoy the benefits of the Limited Warranty.

If any portion of this Limited Warranty is held to be illegal or unenforceable, such partial illegality or unenforceability shall not affect the enforceability of the remainder of the Limited Warranty.
